

Nursery Available during Evening and Sunday Services

A volunteer-staffed nursery for crawlers and toddlers up to 36 months is available for parents attending the service. The nursery is located on the second level of the Dining Hall and opens for Check-In 15 minutes prior to service. Cost is \$2 per service per family or \$15 for the week.

Pet Policy

Animals are not permitted in any Camp & Conference Center building, or on the beach (Department of Health directive). When dogs are not confined within a cottage or trailer, leashes are always required and owners are expected to clean up after their pets.

Advance approval is required when more than two dogs are housed on one lot at any time. At the discretion of BCCC Leadership, dogs may be required to wear a bark collar. Dog owners may be required to remove their dogs from the grounds upon written notice should safety concerns or excessive noise persist.
